I made a full prototype for the final including an ottoman and a little vignette of possible arrangements.




### THE MAKING PROCESS /

FLUX's key features lie in its metal legs. Inspired by the idea of balance, two sides of the legs lift up, allowing space for a side table to enter. The modular nature of the piece allows the chairs to form a community in of its own. The high backs provides the opportunity of privacy while being right next to one another, but doesn't block one's view from nature.
