Survey Insights - Portable BBQ Fire Cooking

- The majority of people marked that they prefer car as their primary form of transport.
- The majority of the responses indicate that people have limited experience with cooking outdoors.
- The majority of the responses indicate that people find the idea of cooking on a portable wood-burning BBQ stove/fire pit fun, relaxing and enjoyable.

Survey conducted anonymously over four days with 33 responses.



How can I design a portable fire pit that enhances both the cooking experience and atmosphere at a cookout.



Clean up. The product should contain its mess and be easy to disassemble for transport home.



Set up. Has to be fast, efficient, and simple. Should not take away from having fun at a BBQ.



Size. The product should fit easily in a trunk. It should also be easy to carry to and from a gathering.



Atmosphere. Fire is social. The product should transition between a cooking device and a bonfire with ease.



Ease of cooking. People want something that cooks well. Should offer more control to the chef.

Self-starter. Seeks out and enjoys different recipes and culinary techniques.








Grill Surfaces - Portable BBQ Fire Cooking







Phases of a Cookout - Portable BBQ Fire Cooking










How it Works - Portable BBQ Fire Cooking









crossbar, flow guide

The crossbar contains the logs and the flame while cooking.

The burning coals are free to be moved by the chef as they so desire.

The shape also creates a chimney effect, which means the fire is efficient and virtually smokeless.

This design allows for total combustion of fuel while also providing the control offered by charcoal.
